I am sure you will have noticed the seats around the Town are now red, white and blue and I would like to thank the Town Councillor's that helped with the painting. I am looking forward to seeing the new granite benches at King Edward Gardens and the Penarwyn Play Area.

St Blaise Town Councillors have tried their very best to get an average speed camera for station Road. We have provided proof of the speeds however the police are denying our figures and blaming the neighbour's perceptions as inaccurate. The Police have suggested a

Community Speed Watch which we are now in the process of arranging.

I enjoyed doing the judging at Par Carnival and congratulate everyone on the quality of their entries, outstanding. Another success for Par and other entrants from the PL24 area.

I was distressed that Cornwall Council had to remove the Skate Park from Bull Engine Park however rest assured the Town Council is doing its best to see another instated as soon as possible.
